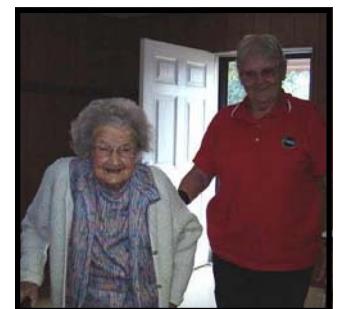

no meal was planned, a corn bread salad, hot dogs, baked beans, chips, and banana pudding was available. Most folks stayed until nearly 3 p.m.

On Saturday, October 9, the second day of the reunion, there were 40 attendees again. The ancestral sites tour was made again by Jerry for a few who had missed out the day earlier. Trudie made one final tour for Phyliss Moffitt Brawley of Greensboro, NC, after the reunion. Phyliss had the STALEY and the FOGLEMAN Bibles, their early family photos, and a huge artist rendering of Eli Ludwig Fogleman, and one of his son, Albion. A covered dish meal was once again shared with everyone.

The 2005 Fogleman Reunion will be held again at Pleasant Hill Church Social Hall, on Friday-Saturday, October 7- 8, 10 AM - 2 PM, with a covered dish lunch each day. In response to an inquiry about the difference in the two-day event, there is no variation between the Friday and Saturday event since going to a non-program reunion. Some relatives attend both days in order to dig a little deeper into the genealogy.

There was a little controversy about the two George / Catharine Fogleman combinations that are buried at Low's Lutheran Church. Jerry and Jimmy said that they believed the rock monumental marker was for the first George and Catharine Fogleman. The death dates were pulled and Jerry stopped by Low's to check the marker. He returned the following day, Saturday, and agreed that the stone appears to be for the second George and Catharine Fogleman. Then, the question of "where is the marker for George I?" There is a Catharine buried in 1811 but where is the other George? The answer might be found on an old stone that reads "Ierd Fogleman." Jerry had asked a lady from Germany about the "Ierd" yet it did not form a word. Although it is inconclusive, the stone being old and worn, may spell the name "Jerg."

Judie Lewis provided an update about Dr. Aaron Fogleman's quest of a professional genealogist to search for Vogelmann's in Germany. There were numerous George Vogelmann's in equally the number of precincts in Germany, and that unless the genealogist was hired to search for a specific George, then he could not verify the one belonging to our family. The odds were

too great to pursue or go in this direction at this time. Details about a similar search by Zebulon Bowman of North Wilkesboro, North Carolina were given, and communication will be initiated to determine whether or not his search might hold clues about our George Vogelmann (Foglemn). Work continues toward:

1) verifying the McCulloh – Willock / George Fogleman home tract / property issue, and 2) the slave dispute. A request was made for information about family Bibles, military information, and stories.

Many reviewed out-of-print Fogleman related material, *The Black-welder and Allied Families of North Carolina and Illinois* by Derward C. Williams and the *The Lord and Fogleman Families* by Clyde W. Lord.
