## *FACTS ABOUT FOGLEMANS— John Shaddy Fogleman*

Details about the John Shaddy Fogleman family appeared in the March 2007 edition of the *Fogleman Newsletter* newsletter. There are three letters and one agreement that date between October 1875 and June 1869. A letter from E. A. Grantham to her dearest Mrs. Celia Ann Fogleman is dated October 20, 1875 and references hard times and Celia's desire to return to South Carolina. Another letter from G. W. McKay of Little Rock, South Carolina to Doc J. G. Fogleman, make reference to the fact that Dr. Fogleman wishes to be back in S.C. Sister Martha Grantham of Marion, S.C., writes about corn, peas, and potatoes and a big cotton crop to C. A. and J. G. Fogleman on June 1, 1869. Then, there is an agreement, undated, giving permission to one party for passing through property so the other party might get fallen timber for firewood. The rest of the history and genealogy appears here [EDITOR'S NOTE: the spelling of names appear as given in the news articles]:

3. ROBERT D.<sup>5</sup> FOGLEMANS (*JEROME G.<sup>4</sup>, JOHN SHADDY<sup>3</sup>, JOHN<sup>2</sup>, HANS GEORGE<sup>1</sup>*) was born in South Carolina, and died 01 Oct 1935 in his home in Phillipsburg, Phillips County, Kansas. He married HATTIE B. HEATH 25 Nov 1886. An obituary--Fogleman dated Thurs, 10 October 1935, in the "Phillips Co. Review" is as follows: "One of Best Known Pioneers Dies at Phillipsburg Home, Tuesday, October First. - R. D. Fogleman, one of the best known of Phillips county's pioneer residents, passed away at his home in Phillipsburg. Tuesday, October 1, following a short illness. Mr. Fogleman had been up town earlier in the day and apparently was enjoying normal health and good spirits.

At the age of 17, Mr. Fogleman came to Phillips county, accompanied by his family of three brothers and one sister. They took a homestead in 1878 and later Mr. Fogleman claimed one for himself. During the rest of his days, Phillips county was his home and since the fall of 1925, he had lived in Phillipsburg.

Mr. Fogleman represented the third commissioner district for four years, from 1920 to 1924, and always took an active interest in civic and community affairs. He united with the Methodist church at LaBelle in 1898 and later transferred his membership to the M. E. church here in town. He was active in church affairs and regular in his attendance.

On November 25, 1886, he was united in marriage to Hattie B. Heath, and to this union, four children were born, Leslie Fogleman, Merced, Calif., Mildred Howard and Lyle Fogleman, Phillipsburg, Mrs. Erma Patterson, Atwood. The family life was of the closest and the widow and all four children, together with nine grandchildren, survive.

Mr. Fogleman lived an exemplary life and was one of our most respected and best known citizens. As the head of a splendid family, as a man interested and active in community and church affairs, his memory will live long with his legion of friends and acquaintances."

Also, a hand-drawn genealogy chart on the on this Fogleman family includes this note: "came to Kansas in a covered wagon. He was married in Phillips County, Kansas, and died in Phillips Co., Kansas."

4. JEROME G.<sup>5</sup> FOGLEMAN, JR. (*JEROME G.<sup>4</sup>, JOHN SHADDY<sup>3</sup>, JOHN<sup>2</sup>, HANS GEORGE<sup>1</sup>*) was born 29 Nov 1863 in Marion County, South Carolina, and died 18 May 1903 in Cripple Creek, Colorado. He married CARRIE M. LOCKHART. An Obituary on Jerome is dated Thursday, 28 May 1903 in the "Phillipsburg Herald," reads "He came to Kansas with his mother in 1889, his father, Jerome G., having died in Aug. 1875, and located in Phillips county where he remained up to eight years ago when he moved to Sheridan county and bought a farm on which he lived until he moved to Cripple Creek two years ago where he engaged in mining. He was married to Miss Carrie M. Lockhart and to this union three children were born. Bro. Fogleman was a child of God, being born to Him about eight years go. He was a faithful husband, father, son and brother: All who knew him loved him and have nothing but love and praise for him. He was a member of the M. E. church of Cripple Creek and was faithful to the last. He leaves a wife to mourn all her life and three little children who must remain fatherless and miss a father's love and care. Also a widowed mother and three brothers and a sister, together with a host of friends who have the sympathy of the entire community. The funeral was conducted by the writer at Iowa Union: text II John 11:25, after which the remains were laid to rest in Iowa Union cemetery, May 21, 1903." Jerome is buried at the Iowa Union Cemetery, being 39 years, 5 months and 29 days old (at time of his death).

5. WILLIAM P.<sup>5</sup> FOGLEMAN (*JEROME G.<sup>4</sup>, JOHN SHADDY<sup>3</sup>, JOHN<sup>2</sup>, HANS GEORGE<sup>1</sup>*) was born 18 Nov 1867, and died 24 Jun 1933 in Phillipsburg, Phillips County, Kansas. He married MARY POMEROY 14 Dec 1893 in Phillipsburg, Kansas. An obituary dated Thursday, 29 June 1933, of the "Phillips County Review," on William P. Fogleman, son of Dr. Jerome and Cecila Fogleman, was born in Warren County, South Carolina Nov 18, 1867 and departed this life at his home north of Phillipsburg, Kansas June 24, 1933 aged 65 years 7 months and 6 days. During his infancy, his parents moved to Montgomery Co., Illinois. At the age eleven years he came together with his four brothers and one sister and widowed mother to Phillips County, where they homesteaded and where he has resided ever since. On December 14, 1893, he was united in marriage to Mary Pomeroy (in) Phillipsburg. To this union were born three children; two sons, Carl Fogleman of Phillipsburg, and Ernest Fogleman of Wichita, one daughter, Mrs. Cecia Begeman of Phillipsbug. All of whom are living and were with him at the end. He leaves to morn his departure, his wife, three children, one brother, R. D. Fogleman of Phillipsburg, six grandchildren and other relatives and friends.

During his life time as one of the early pioneers of Phillips county, he was always a kind, loving husband, and father and a splendid neighbor. His true pioneer spirit often revealed itself in the great concern he bore not only for the members of his immediate family, but also for his neighbors and friends less fortunate than he. In his business dealings, he was very conscientious and just and his word was as good as his bond. With his passing, the community suffers the loss of another of its remaining pioneers.

Many kind hands offered the sympathy and service to the friends who were bereaved, and showed their appreciation of the life of Mr. Fogleman by making the funeral service held at Iowa Union, Sunday, June 25 one of the largest ones held there in years. Service was conducted by Rev. W. M. Millard, using the words, "If a man die, shall he live again?" and "I am come that they might have life."

Interment was made in the Iowa Union cemetery with many friends lingering to offer a word of sympathy and comfort."

In honor of Sandy's memory and love for animals, Dr. Dave McIrvine and his wife, Linda, founders of Sanctuary Camp, a new retreat for families of cancer patients in Emerald Mountain, Colo., have designed a special section for homeless animals trained in pet therapy to be known as the Sandy Buckle Pet Therapy Center.

It has already been established that Hans Georg Vogelmann left Rotterdam on the Ship *Shirley* and arrived on September 5, 1751 in Philadelphia, PA.
