FACTS ABOUT FOGLEMANS - Eli Fogleman

Use of given names often passed down through generations of most early families. That trait appeared to be no different in the Fogleman ancestry and often makes it difficult to trace some of the lineage. A similar example is shown here. Eli, son of Hannah (Boggs) and Peter Fogleman, was born 17 June 1804 in Orange County, North Carolina. Details about Eli's cousin, Eli Ludwig Fogleman and his family appeared in June and the August 2006 issues of the newsletter. Both Eli's were the grandchildren of Peter M. and Anna Margaretha Fogleman, and great-grandsons of Hans George and Catharina (Curtiss) Goetz Fogleman. Eli Ludwig had resided in Randolph County, North Carolina. The affection of a pretty girl by the name of Ruth Hinshaw may have drawn the other Eli away from the border area of Guilford/ Alamance County to Chatham County, not 10 miles from Eli Ludwig.

A few of Eli's siblings migrated away from North Carolina. As reported in an earlier *Fogleman Newsletter*, the opposition to slavery may have caused a few to move away, yet the toll of economic times may have been the reason for others to leave the area. LETITIA FOGLEMAN, b. 27 Nov 1805, Orange County, NC; d. 11 May 1885, West Union FBG, Monrovia, Indiana. Letitia married John Dixon Allen, a Quaker, and moved to Indiana. POLLY FOGLEMAN, b. Abt. 1806; m. YOUNGER ANTHONY, 07 Oct 1823, Orange County, North Carolina. After marrying Younger Anthony, the family moved West. ISAAC FOGLEMAN, b. 14 Dec 1807, Orange County, NC; d. 01 Sep 1871. MARTIN BOGGS FOGLEMAN, b. 1810, Orange County, NC; d. 1868, Guilford County, North Carolina. WILLIAM FOGLEMAN, b. Abt. 1812; d. 17 Dec 1877. ANDERSON FOGLEMAN, b. 13 Jun 1818, Guilford County, NC; d. 17 Oct 1904, Toledo Cemetery, Illinois. JOHN FOGLEMAN, b. 1820, Orange County, NC; d. 01 Feb 1862, Guilford County, NC. SALLY FOGLEMAN, b. Abt. 1827. DANIEL B. FOGLEMAN, b. 1820, NC; m. PHOEBE J. PIKE; b. 1830. A half-brother, MICHAEL⁴ FOGLEMAN, b. 16 Oct 1832, Guilford Co, NC; d. 02 May 1902; m. ELIZABETH LAYTON, 02 May 1855, Guilford County, North Carolina; b. 22 Oct 1834; d. 27 Apr 1922. Lilly Mae – grand-daughter. MICHAEL FOGLEMAN: Baptism: 15 Feb 1835, Coble's Lutheran Church, Guilford County, NC. Marr Banns 30 Apr 1855 in Guilford County, NC. Marriage by F. Shaw, JP. Little is known about the Chamness and Anthony families.

Eli married RUTH HINSHAW in NC, daughter of THOMAS HINSHAW and RUTH ANN. She was born 03 Sep 1811 in NC. Eli was a farmer and a land speculator, buying and selling property in Chatham County, North Carolina. He was the Grantee

Administrator and commissioner aforesaid do hereby grant bargain sell convey and consider with said JOSHUA STOUT his heirs all of the aforesaid tract of land situated on the waters of Cane Creek bounded as following to wit, beginning at a stake MOON old corner and running West 62 poles to a stake in JOHN M. STOUT's line thence North with said STOUT and RUTH FOGLEMAN line 177 poles to a stake or a stone ___? ___ RUTH FOGLEMAN corner thence West 17 ? to an apple tree RUTH FOGLEMAN other corner thence North with RUTH FOGLEMAN line 74 poles to the corner in WM ALBRIGHTs line thence South 76° East with said ALBRIGHT line 47 poles to a stake with positions his corner thence South 60 (?40) poles to a white flint corner thence North 82.2° East 35 poles to a stone or stake thence South 182 poles to the beginning to have and to hold the aforesaid tract of land together with the woods ways mines minerals ? profits and heruntements thereunto belonging or in any wise ascertaining to him the said MALOON STOUTs and his heirs and assigns in fee simple forever and to said RUTH FOGLEMAN for herself and for and in consideration of the aforesaid premises doth hereby relinquish unto the said MALOM STOUT and his heirs sell the right title an estate in said lands which has in every way been vested or ? to her and by those present doth give (?illegible word) quit claim to said land.

This Indenture further witnesseth that the said JOHN M. STOUT, Admr and commissioner for himself and RUTH FOGLEMAN for herself shall and will warrant unto the said MALON and his heirs the title to the aforesaid (?to wit) of land and premises as far as they are acquired by virtue of their assign and administrator and commissioners ELI FOGLEMAN deceased and we further in testimony whereof they have herunto set their hands and seals this day and date first above written.

Eli and family were shown in the 1850 census (Sep 19 1850), in the Upper Regiment of Chatham County, North Carolina. Next door neighbor was John Stout, then John Hinshaw, Ira Hinshaw, William Pickett. William Beard, William Nelson, Aaron Cotner, Welly Anderson (a Blacksmith), and Malcolm Murchison lived in the other direction. The value of real estate appeared between \$125 – 800. Eli was one of the wealthier property owners.

Living two houses away in 1850 was the family of John Hinshaw; one more house farther was the family of John's brother, Ira. Also living nearby were the families of widow, Mary Hinshaw, widow Nancy Hinshaw, Benjamin Hinshaw, William Hinshaw, and William & Mary Hinshaw.

Widow Ruth and family were shown in the 1870 census (Sep 24 1870), Chatham County, North Carolina:

Fogleman, Ruth, age 59, born in North Carolina; keeping house;\$750 real estate; \$500 personal property; can read, cannot write.
Fogleman, Jane, age 31, born in North Carolina.
Fogleman, Taylor, age 19, born in North Carolina; farm laborer; can read, cannot write.
Fogleman, Vandelia, age 12, born in North Carolina.

Living next door in 1870 was the family of son, John Fogleman.

Widow Ruth was shown in the 1880 census living with son, Oliver, and daughter, Lucy Jane in Albright Township, Chatham County, North Carolina.

Fogleman, O., age 48, born in North Carolina; parents born in North Carolina; widower; farmer.

Fogleman, Ruth E., mother, age 69, born in North Carolina; parents born in North Carolina; widow; keeping house.

Fogleman, Jane, sister, age 40, born in North Carolina; parents born in North Carolina; single; keeping house.

Children of ELI FOGLEMAN and RUTH HINSHAW are:

- i. ELIZABETH⁵ FOGLEMAN, b. 01 Feb 1830, NC; d. 11 Aug 1881.
The Pleasant Hill Cemetery record shows that Elizabeth was born in 1858 rather than 1830. It appears that she never married.
- ii. OLIVER THOMAS GUNTER FOGLEMAN, b. 06 Jan 1832, Orange County, NC; d. Indiana.
- iii. MARY ANN FOGLEMAN, b. 13 Jun 1833, NC; d. 19 Jun 1885.
- iv. HANNAH C. FOGLEMAN, b. 15 Dec 1834, Orange County, NC.
- v. ELEANOR NELLIE FOGLEMAN, b. 04 Mar 1836, NC; d. 27 Apr 1911; m. GASTON MURCHISON; b. 13 Jun 1832; d. 14 Feb 1902.
Victor Murchison mentioned in a Memorial Day Service that Eleanor Nellie was a godly woman. Eleanor Nellie and Gaston Murchison had no children. Both are buried at the Pleasant Hill Christian Church Cemetery, Alamance County, NC
- vi. WILLIAM H. FOGLEMAN, b. 09 Feb 1838, NC.
Went West.
- vii. LUCY JANE FOGLEMAN, b. 27 Aug 1839; d. 08 Mar 1883; m. UNKNOWN PIKE. Burial: Pleasant Hill Christian Church Cemetery, Alamance County, NC
- viii. JOHN ANDREW FOGLEMAN, b. 07 Apr 1841, Orange County, NC; d. 22 May 1922, Alamance County, NC.
- ix. YOUNGER RILEY FOGLEMAN, b. 03 Mar 1843, Orange County, NC; d. 25 Sep 1921.
- x. DANIEL FOGLEMAN, b. 18 Sep 1844; d. 11 Sep 1863, Hospital at Fort Delaware. In the North Carolina Troops: 1861 - 1865, Volume 9, shows: Daniel Fogleman Private. Resided in Chatham Co. and enlisted at Camp Holmes near Raleigh at age 18, Nov. 22, 1862 for the war. Present or accounted for until captured at Gettysburg, Pa. July 4, 1863. Confined at Ft. McHenry, MD July 6, 1863. Transferred to Fort Delaware, DE prior to Aug 1, 1863. Died in hospital at Ft. Delaware on Sept 11, 1863 of "anemia and general debility."
Daniel was enlisted in Co. F, 32nd Regiment N.C. Troops, and died after being captured during the War Between The States, also known as the Civil War. He is buried at Finns Park, New Jersey.
- xi. HENRY CLAY FOGLEMAN, b. 02 May 1846, Orange County, NC.
- xii. ISAAC FOGLEMAN, b. 24 May 1849, Alamance County, NC; d. 06 Jun 1926, Patterson Township, Alamance County, NC.
- xiii. MARTIN TAYLOR FOGLEMAN, b. 05 Mar 1851, NC; d. 16 May 1925, Alamance County, North Carolina.

At the age of 49, Eli died of typhoid fever on 30 March 1853. Ruth never married. She lived near other Hinshaw family members. The pain of war affected this family just like most other families during the Civil War (War Between The States) period. Additional information about the sons serving the Confederacy as well as coverage on the children of Eli and Ruth will appear in the next few newsletters.

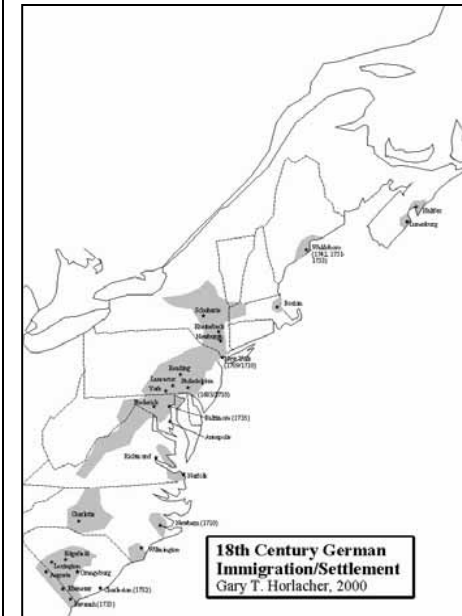
2008 WARD / FOGLEMAN REUNION IN ILLINOIS

The Ward / Fogleman Family Reunion will celebrate a 68 year milestone in Greenup, Illinois in July 2008. After the death of John Fogleman in 1862, Eva Mae (Bowman) Fogleman and children moved from North Carolina to Cumberland County, Illinois in 1865. Grand-daughter Lydia Alberta (Ward) Brown has been instrumental in organizing the Ward / Fogleman Family Reunion since 1940. The upcoming event, however, is going to be very special as the group will be making this one as “full” as possible for Alberta will be 86 years old. The family is also hoping that a few of the BOWMAN family will visit from North Carolina!

The annual event is typically held the last Saturday in July or thereabouts. The organizers will be able to confirm the date by mid-October. The event will be held at the Greenup Municipal Building, Greenup, Cumberland County, Illinois.

- **EVENTS:** On Friday night before, a pitch-in wiener roast is held at Alberta's. There are games and stuff for the kids. Saturday noon—3 PM—Pitch-in reunion. Saturday night from about 5:00 PM—Leftovers and usually pasta / salad night with a memorable fireworks at dark. Sunday morning: biscuits and gravy breakfast with scrambled eggs.etc.
- **HOTELS nearby:** The Daisy Inn Bed and Breakfast, Greenup, Illinois (on-line), a gracious 1917 farmhouse featuring 3 beautiful rooms, one spacious suite, and two 1-bedroom cottages. - **AIRPORTS:** Indianapolis and St. Louis are just about equidistant from Greenup. It may be easier to fly into Indy which is about an hour and one-half ride west to Greenup on I-70.
- **Wares Grove Church** where John Shaddy Fogleman is buried is a little over an hour's drive away and north of Greenup, Illinois.
- **By request ONLY:** Visits to local cemeteries and the Quaker church where many of the Bowman, Fogleman, and other NC family members are buried. Another branch or two were in counties in Indiana.

German Immigration

The German immigration route is much easier to trace with the technology that is available today. It appears that George Fogleman remained in Pennsylvania for around 10 years (1751—1761). Property in that state lists a “Vogel’s Nest” property in York County. It will be interesting to learn more as we dig into the records for this tract of land.

A 1730s ship register will be reviewed to see if the names might be connected with the George and Catharina Vogelmann family. The last name appears as “Vogles or Vogels”.

The above immigration trails shows how and why some Fogleman families decided to live in Virginia or the Carolinas. More information will appear on this topic and the Great Wagon Trail from Pennsylvania to North Carolina.
